### *Four New Task Forces Formed*

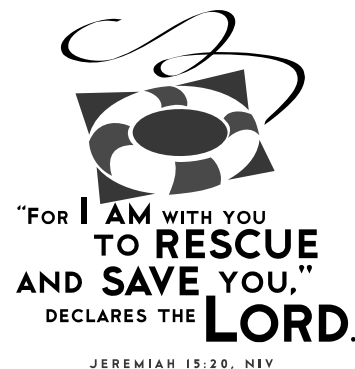

### **Children of Pearlington Will Soon Have a New School**

Since devastated by Hurricane Katrina, Pearlington has had to rebuild almost from scratch. With no safe buildings in which to resume classes, the children were bussed an hour away to another school within the school district, holding classes in empty classrooms with two grades to a room. They had few materials, other than what the teachers could get donated for long periods of time. Donations were the mainstay of those classrooms and are still used today.

Through relief efforts, the children of Pearlington and Gulfview eventually got trailers to move into on that far-away campus. Last summer, through the efforts of many, grants were obtained to FINALLY get the remaining parts of the school building safe enough to run a four-week camp for these children in their own community. "Safe enough" meant a camp with playgrounds full of cement, broken glass, debris and parts of playground equipment - with a dorm for volunteers in one classroom behind doors that were still not fixed and boarded up windows.

The GOOD NEWS is that these children are finally looking forward to having a new school building of their own with one other community. South Hancock Elementary is scheduled to open THIS AUGUST! Check out the school website for pictures!

#### ***Trip Has Proven Fun, Tough and Thought-provoking***

*Hi everyone,*

*I hope your summers are going well, mine sure is! I'm not able to write much now, due to limited email access (this may be my only email until I get back to the states), but I wanted to send you all a link to the site where we're keeping a team journal. Every week or so we'll be adding a post describing what's going on and how we're all doing.*

*The link is [www.globalurbantrek.org](http://www.globalurbantrek.org), and then click on the Cairo (Mokattam) link on the right side. We'll also hopefully upload a few photos.*

*As for me personally, this trip has been fun, but tough - and very thought provoking. Facing the poverty here is challenging, and raising lots of questions in my heart and mind. It's wonderful to be able to begin forming relationships with the boys I work with at the recycling school, the workers we're helping at an orphanage, and many others in the town and at the Monastery. The language barrier is formidable, but we're able to connect through our broken Arabic, their broken English, and plenty of gestures and smiles.*

*Please continue to pray for us as we head into the last two weeks here. We're continuing to seek out relationships with the people in Mokattam, in order to encourage one another and to learn about their lives here.*

### ***At the June 17 meeting the Congregation Council:***

- Heard that giving is a bit behind, but expenses are about where expected to be at this time of year.
- Heard from several Ministry Teams.
- Learned that PoP has received a \$3,000 legacy gift from Grace, Trenton, through the Mercer Mission Cluster to benefit youth and young adults and then designated it for renovations and furniture needed to further ministry with those groups.
- Approved a request from the Space Renovation Team to have up to two second offerings this summer to assist with much-needed renovations of the church school rooms and to take advantage of Thrivent matching funds.
- Discussed plans for the June 29 Congregation Meeting to gather our visions and dreams for what God is calling us to do now and in the future at Prince of Peace.
- Agreed on September 13 as the date for the 2008 Annual Council Retreat.
- Approved Pastor Lutz's request to "repurpose" some of his continuing education money for promoting a healthy lifestyle through a membership at the RWJ Health Center.
- Agreed to create the J. H. Lamont Gunkel Memorial Fund to benefit PoP Youth, through a generous gift from the Gunkel family.
- Considered appointment of several new Task Forces to explore the possibilities of a property renovation program.

## Thrivent Builds - Trips to the Gulf New Trip Approved for Late September

Monica E Kanopka, Lutheran Community Services Specialist for the NE Region of Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, has been approved as a team leader for a **Thrivent Builds Trip** to Biloxi, Mississippi, Sept 29 - Oct 4. Would you like to become part of the team or do you know someone else that might be interested? Here are some of the details:

Total room and board, cost for the week for Thrivent Benefit Members \$249, all others \$349. (This does not include transportation to Gulfport, MS).

Trip includes four build days as we work on building one of the 40 new houses that Thrivent Financial is contributing to this area.

We will be staying at Yankee stadium, which has air-conditioned bunk houses (8-10 per room, no cots) and dining in Yankee Stadium Commons area with many other volunteers from across the United States

The \$249 is all-inclusive and includes transportation from the Gulfport airport, use of a provided van for the week, a night out to enjoy Southern Cuisine, a tour of the devastated Gulf coast and dinner with the family who will receive one of the 40 Thrivent-sponsored homes.

You do not need any construction experience to be part of this team. You do not need to bring any tools along with you as Habit for Humanity Biloxi will provide any that we need.

The maximum size of the team is 15. If there are many that are interested, we have two other teams traveling to Biloxi: one September 22 - 29 (led by Joel Slesak) and a second trip the same week as this one (led by Barb Giger). They are also going to be looking for volunteers to join their teams. If you would rather travel that week please let me know.

This was a prestigious nomination from his high school teachers in Monroe and he spent the whole week at the Rider dorms. He was appointed as a councilman and was part of the Boys State band.

Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for high school students. It is a participatory program where each participant becomes a part of the operation of his local, county and state government. Participants are exposed to the rights, privileges, duties and responsibilities of a franchised citizen. The training is objective and practical with city, county and state governments operated by the students elected to the various offices. Activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, chorus and recreational programs.

The program was the idea of two Illinois Legionnaires, Hayes Kennedy and Harold Card in 1935. The American Legion Auxiliary sponsors a similar program for high school girls called Girls State.

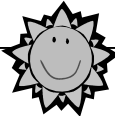
