## From the MINISTER

I am writing this column from a desk in my dorm at Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, GA. I am here the first two weeks of July for my third class in the Doctor of Educational Ministry (DEdMin) professional degree program.

At this time in the program I need to make a decision about my practicum. The practicum is a yearlong experience that pulls together readings, supervision and a peer group around a particular educational focus.

Perhaps it will be no surprise you but the focus of my practicum is biblical storytelling and its relation to faith formation. From this September to next, I will work with all interested individuals in the creation of a **greater Princeton "Scriptures by Heart" troupe.**

This network of novice and competent biblical storytellers will meet regularly to learn, practice, perform and reflect on the practice of biblical storytelling. Participants will be from various faith traditions and will strive to perform the scriptures by heart every week in their worship setting. Who do you know that ought to be a part of this?

In addition to the "Scriptures by Heart" troupe there will be opportunities for you to be involved in biblical storytelling throughout the year. Once again on this Rally Day, September 11, everyone who is interested is invited to be part of our Biblical Storytelling Festival. What better way to commemorate the tragic events of 2001 than by telling a more powerful, more truthful, more hopeful story, instead of one of human evil and destruction.

Is there a biblical story you would like to learn and tell? Is there a biblical story you already know and could share? Just let me know and you can be part of our biblical storytelling festival.

Shortly after you read this column, Joan New and I will be in Orlando, FL at the churchwide assembly. On three of the five days that the assembly is in session there will be a Book of Faith bible conversation. The first conversation amongst the over 1,000 voting members and visitors, from all 65 synods, will be on John 4: 3-29; the story of the woman at the well. The second story told will be Galatians 5: 1-14; where the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." And, the third bible conversation will be inspired from a listening to Isaiah 55; the power of God's word to accomplish that for which it was sent.

Joan and I, elected voting members from the NJ synod, have been asked to be the biblical storytellers at the churchwide assembly! What an honor and privilege. Please hold us in prayer the week on August 15-19. We'll tell you all about it over Coffee and Conversation on August 28. In the meantime, be thinking about what bible story you'd like to learn by heart. There are lots of really good ones.

## Why I Teach Sunday School

I “got out of” teaching Sunday School for a few years; I had a toddler clinging to me. He refused to stay in the nursery without me, until that happy day last August when he finally trusted the teenage helpers. The phone call came in September that Sunday School teachers were desperately needed.

“I’ll do it” I said, “The Holy Spirit has moved John to let go of my leg.”

I had no experience with Sunday School and didn’t know all the kids in my class. But I found the Spark curriculum handbook easy to use. It had prayers, activities, crafts and puzzles related to the readings for that day. When I planned ahead, it was simple. Even when I crammed the night before, it wasn’t hard. The church closet was \*full\* of paper, scissors, glue, feathers, stickers, and foam for easy crafts. The internet had enough extra ideas for a thousand class hours. So, the logistics were easy.

### What I learned these short months as a Sunday School teacher:

- Kids really want to talk about God, the meaning of life, miracles and loving one’s neighbor. I also found out about what happened at school that week, and their birthday.
- Kids learn by doing, especially after having to sit and listen in church. They need to move around, play Bible Verse fill-in-the-blanks on the board, make projects, go on a hunt for signs of spring, and act out or draw the lesson of the day.
- Sunday School really is a community. Unique discussions deepen through the year as we all get to know each other; it becomes easy to be together.
- Kids listen to the music in church. As we color or cut, they spontaneously sing pieces of the liturgy or a hymn from that morning that stuck in their head. It is incredibly sweet.
- Teaching deepens my experience of the readings and service. I read next week’s lesson and focus laser like on “What will kids ask about this?” “What is the essence that I can get across to wiggly kids?” and crucially “How does it relate to them?”
- I even listen differently in the 8:30 worship service, for last-minute tips for my class. My main visual aid for discussion is often the bulletin cover, which I barely glanced at a year ago.
- Crafts and handouts aren’t just crafts and handouts. We spark car discussions and help families decorate their house with reminders of God.

### What I miss as a Sunday School teacher:

- An excuse to sleep in and skip church.
- Long, leisurely noshes at the fellowship table.
- Java discussions with adults.

That’s about it. And it is worth missing those things. I don’t need the excuses or calories, and there will be seasons for more adult Bible discussion. These seasons with the kids are priceless.

Is the Holy Spirit moving you to share time with kids? I’m sure there are still openings at every age group. We like to have two or three people rotate teaching in each class, so we each have time for Java or weekend trips. If PoP disciples join in, it is a commitment of 12 to 18 classes, a grand total of 24 to 36 hours a year, including prep time at home. Do you have about three hours a month, including Fellowship Hour, to contribute?

This is evangelism to people with wide-open hearts and eager questions. You don’t have to be a parent of young kids to lead kids. Many people are more effective and patient with kids when they are \*not\* with them 24/7. Worried that you aren’t a Bible scholar and that the kids will stump you? Maybe they will; maybe you’ll have to get back to them on something. It’s a great way to keep learning and growing in the faith.

Stewardship Question and Answer:

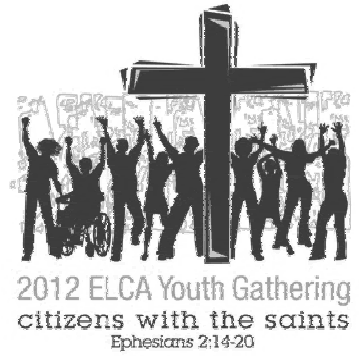
**Q.** I see in the bulletin every week an update on last week's giving, and an "amount needed" to match our budget. On most weeks, the amount received is less than that needed. How can PoP keep paying its bills?

**A.** As with most churches, giving is not uniform throughout the year, but peaks at Easter and Christmas. Many people make a yearly gift or an extra one, right at the end of the calendar year. So, our budget is tight, but we have generally met our planned budget even though individual weeks are often "in the red."

Nevertheless, the church does face a cash-flow problem in the summer months, as giving (and attendance) fall off. We have a small reserve, but the treasurer and council have to monitor expenses carefully during these months. If you can arrange to keep your giving steady during the summer, or even prepay before going on vacation, that would be a big help.

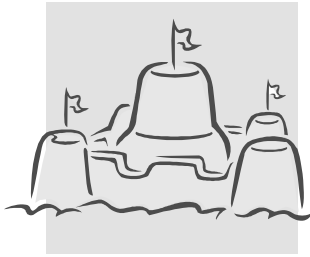

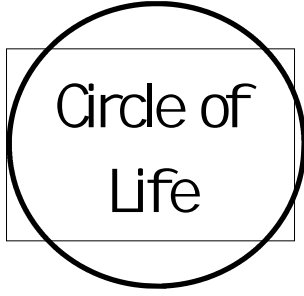
